## **Full Stop Australia seeks investment for sexual** violence response in NSW 2025-26 budget.

Full Stop Australia is calling on the New South Wales Government to increase its investment in response to the escalating crisis of sexual violence in the state. Full Stop Australia has submitted a compelling proposal to the NSW Government for the 2025-26 budget, titled 'Investing in Safety.'

Full Stop Australia's submission calls for:

- 1. The development of a Sexual Violence Justice Navigators pilot that includes dedicated support people who assist victim-survivors of sexual violence to navigate the justice system, make informed choices between justice options, and access key services.
- 2. A place-based approach to addressing sexual violence by rolling out targeted 'Good Night Out' training for nightlife venues in Sydney's CBD

In 2024 BOCSAR revealed a 42% increase in reported sexual assaults in NSW over the past five years and in the year leading up to September 2024, one in four reported sexual offences in NSW occurred within licensed venues in Sydney's CBD. Despite this increase in incident reporting, the path to justice for victim-survivors remains fraught with challenges, as underscored by BOCSAR's May 2024 report on attrition of sexual violence in NSW courts and the damning rate of conviction for these serious crimes.

Director of Clinical and Client Services, Tara Hunter, said "sexual violence remains an insidious and far too common form of abuse. We know that there are ongoing challenges for victim-survivors impacted by sexual assault and rape navigating through our systems. There remains little accountability for perpetrators and limited justice for victimsurvivors."
