Alarming rates of sexual violence perpetration underscore need for commensurate action.

The Australian Institute of Criminology has released data examining the rate of selfassessed sexual violence perpetration amongst Australian adults. The report outlines that around 12.5% of respondents (1 in 6 men and 1 in 20 women) had perpetrated sexual assault as adults. 'Sexual assault' is used in the AIC report to refer to rape, stealthing, and nonconsensual touching and kissing.

People using sexual violence know that what they are doing is wrong. The data debunks an entrenched myth about sexual violence—that perpetrators do not understand the gravity of their actions. This is why affirmative consent laws are so critical in protecting and supporting victim-survivors. It is important to shift the onus of responsibility for sexual violence onto the people committing it.

Perpetration studies provide an important window into a side of the conversation that is almost never heard. "Sexual violence is often either invisible or responded to in a vacuum of victimisation. Communities are yet to come to terms with the fact that people, some we know, knowingly perpetrate sexual violence." Said Full Stop Australia CEO, Karen Bevan.

We need a significant increase in attention and support for specialist sexual violence responses as well as targeted and evidence-based prevention programs that shift the norms and beliefs that drive sexual violence and minimise accountability. We need to adequately fund sexual violence prevention, response, recovery and healing.
